

Teller County Electrical Contemporaneous Review

Mandated by the

EFFECTIVE DATE: January 1, 2020

Teller County will conduct onsite inspections for compliance with C.R.S. 12-115-120 (1) and (10), when applicable, during a requested electrical inspection. Prior to the inspection, the inspector will check to verify that the listed electrical contractor has a current registration on file with the Building Department. If no registration is on file, no inspection will take place.

When applicable, the inspector will verify licensure of all electricians and registrations for all Apprentice electricians on the job site. Licensee-to apprentice ratio will be verified at this time as well.

If the worker's do not have a copy of their license and/or registration with them, they will be given an opportunity to provide the necessary documents to the inspector in a reasonable amount of time. If documentation is not received, no further electrical inspections will take place on the project until the matter is resolved.

**Please note:**

Teller County's licensing program requires that all electrical contractors be registered with Teller County Building Department. Criteria for obtaining a registration is that the contractor provide a copy for their current State Licensed Master Electrician as well as a State Contractor License. Once all criteria is met a registration will be issued and they will be entered in to our electronic contractor data base, which is tied to our permit tracking program.

If a permit application for electrical work is submitted with an unregistered electrical company or with an electrical company with an expired Teller County registration, the permit will not be issued.

If the electrical inspector conducts an inspection where electrical work has been done by an unregistered electrical company, the inspection will be failed. No further electrical inspections will occur until the matter is resolved.
